# Leaving a Legacy

Dear Friends,

When Ed and I first started searching for a church, the first thing we did was to look at the church websites.

The website for First United Presbyterian Church of Tarentum (FUPCT) spoke to us loudly and clearly. This website told us everything we needed to know about this church. All the normal things like the name of the Reverend and staff, and what time the Service and Sunday School is. But we also learned this church is a Matthew 25 participant, bringing hope to those in need. The Matthew 25 project has helped with the water crisis in Arkansas City, helped Tennessee following the tornadoes, and helped the Blue Ash Nonprofit to deploy a team to Maui. The Vision and Mission statement of this church offers full inclusion which welcomes everyone. We learned about the ways this church takes part in the life of the community and beyond with mission trips. Ed and I were never sitting or standing alone. Someone was always there just like a "wing man" right by our side.

Indeed, it was a joy and privilege to join this church. And as members, it is also up to us to offer ourselves back to the church. We feel responsible to contribute as best we can with our time, talents, and financial resources so this church can continue its mission. Although giving financially is especially important, sometimes that is the easy part. Sometimes the hard part is to give of ourselves. It has been our experience that until we do offer to give of ourselves in fellowship with other members, or join a committee, or help with a specific function in the life of the church, this church will just be a church. So, we did join a Bible Study, engaged with members during fellowship hour and helped in other ways also. Now FUPCT truly does feel like it is OUR church too. Thank you for welcoming us in.
