One: For to us a child is born! A Savior is given!

People: **He will be called ‘Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace!’ He will bring justice for the poor and defend the rights of the helpless. He will nourish the righteous and embody love. He will bring peace for lions and lambs, hawks and doves, people and peoples.**

One: Jesus said, “I am the light of the world; he who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.”

People: **Why do we light all the candles tonight?**

One: The four candles on the outside represent the four weeks of Advent. The middle candle is called the Christ Candle. It is white, representing the purity and sinlessness of Christ. We light the Christ Candle tonight in celebration of Jesus Christ, the Savior of the World.

We light the Christ Candle. We light these candles as a sign of the coming light of Christ. Advent means coming.

(All Candles are lit at this time)

We are preparing ourselves for the days when the nations shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war anymore. The wolf shall dwell with the lambs, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them.

One: The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom, like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing. The Lord will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel. The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who live in a land of deep darkness on them light has shined. Let us walk in the light of the Lord.

Let us pray.

People: **Gracious God, let all who yearn for new beginnings take heart in this light. When God comes as a child we open ourselves to wonder, to love and to hope. His light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. Let the joy of Christmas fill our hearts. This is the light of Emmanuel, the Christ Candle. Amen.**
